


A short history of Futures Studies

- Writings by professor Pentti Malaska starting in 1974 and followed by
- a series of seminars touching global issues and discussing the global model plus problem-solving concerns
- Initiatives to start more permanent structures and institutions in Finland


Finland as a "Futures puzzle"

- NGO: Finnish Society for Futures Studies 1980
- NGO: Finnish Association for the Club of Rome 1984
- Parliament: Committee for the Future 1992
- Universities: Finland Futures Research Centre 1992
- Universities: Finland Futures Academy 1998
